#### 1. Aims

- 1.1 It is the aim of The Peterborough Keys Academies Trust that all of its schools will:
  - (a) Have high expectations for every learner in every school in PKAT.
  - (b) Expect all learners to work hard and try their best at all times.
  - (c) Enable excellent learning to happen.
  - (d) Create excitement around learning, with all leaners wanting to learn, transforming from novice to expert learners as they journey through their school years.
  - (e) Develop creativity and curiosity in learners; inspiring them to be the best versions of themselves.
  - (f) Prepare learners to unlock their full potential; giving students key learning tools to achieve the best outcome possible for their future lives.

#### 2. Our Approach

- 2.1 We have informed our approach to Teaching and Learning based on current research and evidence, including cognitive science.
- 2.2 We present material in small steps, model and use guided practice to support learners' written work.
- 2.3 We make use of frequent, high-quality and responsive formative assessment throughout every lesson; asking questions, checking for understanding and responding to misconceptions.
- 2.4 We expect all teachers across PKAT to plan and deliver lessons that include:
  - (a) Embedded routines and clear high expectations for behavior
  - (b) Regular opportunities for review and retrieval practice
  - (c) High expectations for learning, i.e. planning for the highest attaining learner(s) in the class ('pitch it up')
  - (d) Adapting teaching; creating reasonable adjustments to the curriculum for those that need it without losing high expectations for all;
  - (e) Scaffolding to enable all learners to reach the high expectations of the learning
  - (f) High quality explanations focusing on one stimuli at a time to avoid cognitive overload
  - (g) Modelling of excellence by the teacher including live modelling of work

- (h) Effective checking for understanding
- (i) Guided practice, with the teacher giving instant feedback
